More than just good business

Our Story

McCallum's proud history shows the commitment of the organisation to improving the lives of people with a disability since it was established in 1953 as detailed below:

McCallum House arose from a challenge by prominent psychiatrist and leader in his field, Dr E. Cunningham Dax to the Ballarat Y's Men's Club, for the need to construct a facility in Ballarat to provide education, welfare and therapy for children with disabilities. That was in 1953, when Mr R. Austin McCallum was the President of the Y's Men's Club, and it was through his and the other members' passion and drive, that this dream became a reality. With assistance from State Government, and donated labour from the Master Builders, Master Plumbers and Master Painters Associations, the building was completed and opened by the Honourable Henry Bolte MP in 1955.

Over the years, the organisation has grown and developed a range of services, and the client base has changed from children to adults. In 1982, a larger Day Centre was constructed in Alfredton, and although many of the services provided by the organisation are based in the community, this facility remains in constant use.

In 1995, the name was changed to McCallum Community Services, and in 1997 the organisation merged with Central Highlands Regional Residential Association and Central Highlands Independent Living Inc to form McCallum Disability Services Inc.

In 2004 McCallum relocated its supported employment program 'McCallum Industries' from Beverin Street into a new modern factory at 1820 Sturt Street West.

In 2005 a Master Plan was completed after extensive consultation. This Master Plan focused on further redevelopment of McCallum Community Centre and the establishment of Independent Living Units on vacant land in Leopold Street to provide people with disabilities with another accommodation option.

In 2007 the MCC Art/Pottery program was relocated to the Mobility Room within the Learmonth Street complex. The East Wing of the McCallum Community Centre was also refurbished to take clients from the former White House unit located nearby.

A confectionery business "Ollies Lollies" was established and opened at McCallum Industries in August 2008.

JG King Homes was awarded the contract to build seven independent living units on land in Leopold Street and these were completed and handed over to McCallum in late February, 2009. The units were officially opened by then Premier of Victoria the Honourable John Brumby, MP on 14th April, 2009. Residents took up occupancy in the units in April, 2009.

There are plans to build a new factory at McCallum Industries to meet further expansion and acquire a new facility for Club LOWD to meet increased demands in 2011. An upgrade of the Administration Centre in Learmonth Street is also under review and the construction of additional accommodation options on available crown land is also under investigation.

McCallum continues to provide services to people with intellectual, physical and sensory disabilities and strives to deliver these programs in an environment of continuous quality improvement.

Board of Management Report

Another year has come and gone and we are pleased to say that McCallum is continuing to meet the expectations of the people who use our services. At times McCallum believes it is on top of the issues then another arises and must be addressed. Nothing is ever plain sailing in the disability sector.

The Board has been well informed of the changes across the disability sector through information provided by National Disability Services. In addition to this the Board continues to undergo professional development. Training in self directed approaches was provided by Training Consultants *field* and covered the reorientation of disability supports and the implications of self directed approaches for disability providers and their Boards.

The Board has also greatly appreciated the opportunity to attend Grampians Board Dinner forums not only to hear speakers on topical issues facing the disability sector but to have the opportunity to network with other Board Members from disability services in the region.

McCallum has recognised a number of challenges for day programs within the context of the reorientation of day services and the move towards individualized client funding by the Department of Human Services [DHS]. McCallum in conjunction with DHS has implemented a review of Day Programs. At the time of writing, this review being undertaken by the Dyson Consulting group, was underway. The key objective of the review is to examine: the governance, management, service planning and delivery of day program services to identify any improvements that can be recommended. Imperative for McCallum is that the consultants undertake a thorough examination of the directions being set by McCallum for the day program services and how these relate

to McCallum's participation in the wider community and DHS's expectations of service delivery.

In order to inform the current effectiveness and the future direction of day program activities, the consultants will take into account the recent State quality audit outcomes and provide comment on:

- Effectiveness of program delivery within the current state Government Day Program funding environment as outlined by DHS in the Policy and Funding plan.
- Outcomes based on participant goals identified and met.
- Strategic planning for McCallum regarding future development of existing services and new opportunities to assist with growth.
- Consider day program services in relation to the range of state funded disability services operated by McCallum and any opportunities or synergies that exist across the organisation.
- Areas for growth within the State's disability specific programs, or broader community need.
- Provide recommendations based on the findings.

A McCallum wide view will enable informed decision making for the organisation in managing and setting future directions for Day Programs.

A part of the State/Commonwealth My Future My Choice [MFMC] and Older Cares Initiative McCallum has taken up the lease on a residential facility at Spencer Street, Sebastopol. The aim of MFMC is to provide better living options for younger people with a disability who are living, or at risk of entry to residential aged care. The Older Carers initiative is to provide an accommodation option for people with disabilities who have carers who are over 65 years of age and no longer able to provide the care required to keep them at home. Spencer Street will provide a home for two people via the MFMC initiative and three people from the Older Carers initiative. The single unit attached to the Spencer Street home is for an individual who has the ability to live independently. DHS provided capital funds to meet establishment costs within the home and recurrent funding is still to be finalised.

McCallum undertakes a low key annual appeal each year based on those who have donated in the past and who are now on its donor base. The annual appeal is always well supported and if anyone would like to make a donation they are encouraged to do so. To those who regularly support the annual appeal we extend our sincere thanks.

The Strategic Plan is a living document and is reviewed every twelve months to ensure that it reflects the directions that McCallum wishes to pursue. Details on the current Strategic Plan are shown elsewhere in this report. The Major Building Capital Works Program is integral to the implementation of the Strategic Plan to build a new factory at McCallum Industries on land available in Production Drive. In 2011-2012 McCallum plans to acquire a more suitable facility for Club LOWD to address the projected growth in that program and investigate options to redevelop the Administration Centre.

Board of Management Report *continued*

McCallum has invested \$87,140 in mechanized packing equipment for McCallum Industries to enable it to volume pack, particularly confectionery. The Helen Macpherson Smith Trust kindly contributed a further \$22,860 towards the total purchase price of \$110,000. Installation of the equipment on site is nearing completion.

The Victorian Hospitals Industrial Association were engaged to undertake an audit of McCallum's human resources function and recommendations made in the report have been implemented.

McCallum has only a few volunteers who assist regularly, however a volunteer information pack has been developed. This includes documentation covering volunteer recruitment and coordination, preparing for and managing volunteers and volunteers position description. For those volunteers who assist McCallum we are truly grateful for their generous support.

McCallum has thrown its support behind the campaign for a National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS). The Board believe that the NDIS represents a once in a lifetime opportunity to transform the lives of people with a disability, their families, and carers in Australia. We ask McCallum supporters to also add their support by registering on line at www.everyaustraliancounts.org.au. McCallum is pleased that it has been able to host a number of NDIS forums in Ballarat recently.

All State Programs were independently assessed against the Disability Framework during a four day audit in November 2010. McCallum received certification and congratulations are extended to all staff for their effort in preparing for the audit. McCallum prides itself on delivering quality services so it was pleasing to have an independent opinion that this is the case. The Commonwealth supported employment program at McCallum Industries has

been accredited for many years and this has been achieved through the continuing commitment of the staff employed. Our congratulations are extended to all staff for this achievement.

Sadly this year due to promotion to Melbourne the McCallum Patron, Bruce Morgan advised that he could no longer continue in that role. Bruce had given McCallum tremendous support and assistance since first assuming the role in 2002/2003. We extend our sincere thanks and very best wishes to Bruce for the future. We were extremely fortunate that the new Courier General Manager, Angela Carey kindly agreed to accept this mantle and we have enjoyed the involvement with Angela to date.

At McCallum storage is always a problem. To try alleviate this at the Learmonth Street site a storage shed across the back of the quadrangle was built at a cost of \$72,000. This area in the main will be used for archive storage. The record retention policy has been reviewed and refined to ensure records are disposed of at appropriate times.





A new telephone system was installed in the Administration Centre to replace the old system which had major faults at a cost of \$14,878.

We will be pursuing all avenues available to enable more independent living units to be built on the crown that we have under McCallum's management. The current Independent Living Unit complex has been an outstanding success allowing residents to take control of their lives. In the next phase of development a number of single units will be built when funding becomes available.

We would like to encourage all family members to become formal members of McCallum. A strong membership base is fundamental to a strong disability service. Membership can be arranged by contacting the Administration Centre. We were heartened to see many family members at the annual general meeting last year and would appreciate them all becoming members.

McCallum gains certification in State funded Programs

McCallum underwent a four day audit of State funded programs in November 2010. Three independent auditors assessed McCallum's programs against the Standards for Disability Services in Victoria which are part of the requirements within the Disability Act 2006. There was a great deal of preparation that went into getting ready for the survey by staff who had to assess program delivery against the Industry Standards and Outcome Standards. This was a good exercise as it identified where further improvements were required prior to audit. In January 2011, McCallum was advised that it had been granted certification which was very pleasing. Improvements were identified that McCallum must address before the next audit. Congratulations are extended to all staff for this achievement. Many thanks are also extended to the many clients and family members who made themselves available to meet with the auditors whilst they were at McCallum.

McCallum will undergo a surveillance audit every twelve months and a full audit every three years.

On 7th March 2011, an afternoon tea was held to celebrate McCallum's achievement. It was mentioned at the afternoon tea that McCallum Industries has been certified under the Commonwealth quality guidelines on a number occasions which is an outstanding accomplishment.

Accommodation & Home Support

We have had another exciting year for the Accommodation and Home Support Programs. As the end of my first year as Accommodation and Home Support Manager draws near, I have been delighted to be in the role as manager in a year that has seen some great outcomes for both programs.

Home Support

Kathy and her team in the Home Support program have implemented some innovative programs this year and continues to work towards building the independence of people with disabilities. People who we support have been invited and have joined in some of the following programs;

- The Lead On film Project provided an opportunity for clients to express and articulate their achievements as they develop their independent living skills.
- The Café Connections has provided an informal opportunity for the program to showcase achievements to clients, their families and the community.
- The Community Liaison Group provides a link to the community and promotes current and new programs available through Home Support.

These projects have formed advocacy and disability awareness groups for McCallum. Representatives have attended different training providers around Ballarat to talk about their programs and further reflect on their own supports and identify what is important to them.

Accommodation

Janet Wraith commenced her role as Assistant Manager in February this year. Janet's knowledge, experience and organization has been vital in providing a smooth transition for the residents moving into the new residential service in Spencer St. It has been an incredibly exciting time for 4 people and their families who have made Spencer St. their home. This project has been in progress for 3 years and to the delight of both McCallum and prospective new residents opened in May 2011.

Through our planning process and house meetings the people living in our homes have organised with staff, some great activities. Families have been invited and have joined in some of the following activities; Easter Egg Hunts, Christmas in July, gold digging in Dunolly, a stay at Dunkeld, Chinese festival in Bendigo, Motor Show in Melbourne, watching Pandas in Adelaide, chilling out on the Ghan train, skiing at Falls Creek, pampering weekends on the coast, visit to the circus, barracking for a local football team, local beach holidays and enjoying the sunshine on the Gold Coast. Other holiday destinations have been Great Ocean Road and Phillip Island.

Other people have experienced major achievements such as succeeding in their own shopping programs, mastering the ATM, going to the bakery independently to get lunch, changing some of their work activities and doing a mural for their lounge room.

Program Staff

We have continued to support the professional development of staff by providing ongoing opportunities for training. In addition to core components, specific education and professional development has included:

- Managing the Ageing process – Dementia and Downs Syndrome
- Dysphasia and swallowing
- My Future My Choice (MFMC) Accommodation Service Providers Forum
- MFMC – ABI and Family Sensitive Practice
- MFMC- Understanding and supporting people with ABI
- Fire Safety Training
- Grief and Loss
- South West Disability Network Conference & Reorient Express Forum
- VALID – Having a Say in Your Plan
- MFMC/Spencer St Induction and orientation
- Introduction to Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC)

Through collaboration with CVGT Employment & Training and University of Ballarat, McCallum has been able to support several staff to complete Certificate IV in disability, and ten staff who are currently studying to achieve a Diploma in Disability Studies.

Conclusion

On reflection of the achievements in both programs over the past twelve months, I must recognise the dedication and hard work of the Accommodation and Home Support staff teams. They are always willing to go above and beyond expectations in supporting people and that makes a real difference.

I look forward to the year ahead with great excitement with the knowledge that we are in a very good position to move into the next year with confidence.

New accommodation in Sebastopol

In 2008, McCallum was successful in their submission to the Department of Human Services to manage accommodation through the My Future My Choice and Aging Carers which is funded jointly through the Commonwealth and State Governments. Staff provide support 24 hours a day, to respond to the individual needs and goals of each resident. A major focus of the project is community participation, independence and individual lifestyle. McCallum is very excited to play an integral role in this great opportunity for people who may otherwise have no other option but an aged care facility. It has been an incredibly exciting time for 4 people and their families who have made Spencer St. their home. This project has been in progress for 3 years and to the delight of both McCallum and prospective new residents opened in May 2011.

The move for some of the residents has been life-changing. There are two people living at Spencer St who couldn't easily access transport other than taxis and trains, as their mobility depends on electric wheelchairs. They have only been able to travel in the immediate Ballarat area for many years. At a house meeting they decided they would like to go for a drive as they now have a bus they can access. Staff suggested having a look at Lake Burrumbeet as it now has water in it. They replied 'It has always had water in it'. They had not been on the Western highway in a vehicle in 10 years. One resident when he first entered his new home declared 'He would like to see the new bath'. He can't remember the last time he was able to bath and not shower. Spencer has a state of the art hydrotherapy bath with ceiling hoist. He was looking forward to a soak and chilling out.

Happenings in our Homes

Throughout the football season, a keen group of supporters from different houses have attended the local Central Highland Football League. At these matches, the lads have met football players and officials and have been included in the centre of the ground activities. As well, the President of League has given them tickets for the final series, including the Grand Final. All the guys are chuffed!

Building Connections

McCallum Home Support provides 1:1 community or home based support to people supported by an Individual Support Package, Outreach or via Fee for Services. The program has implemented a number of new initiatives in the past year, including six-monthly afternoon teas in the format of Café Connections. It is an opportunity for McCallum Home Support to present current projects and initiatives and to invite guest speakers. The Café Connections has provided an informal opportunity for the program to showcase achievements to clients, their families and the community. This has given carers and families the opportunity to share their stories and build relationships with people in similar situations. Café Connections also provides an informal avenue for people with disabilities and their families to ask questions and gain information about supports.

A Community Liaison Group has also been established to provide a link to the community and promotes current and new programs available through Home Support. This has formed an advocacy and disability awareness group for McCallum. Representatives have attended different training providers around Ballarat to talk about their programs and further reflect on their own supports and identify what is important to them. Representatives from the community liaison group also participate in interviewing new staff for our program. They have developed their own questions and interview template. This information is fed back to McCallum management and is a component of our stage two interview process.

Another exciting development has been the partnership with Lead On Ballarat and the development of the film titled "living life to the max!". The Lead On film Project provided an opportunity for clients to express and articulate their achievements as they develop their independent living skills. The people who have participated have increased confidence. Not just in front of the camera, but through program reflection and it has also been beneficial in reviewing individual supports and planning for the year ahead. Participants have developed close relationships and friendships, often catching up for a coffee. These people were strangers initially before the program began. Two of the volunteers from the University of Ballarat are now employed at McCallum through the volunteer work experience gained. People also developed travel training and skills to get to and from the filming each week, and are now able to use public transport independently. Clients and staff have also developed skill and experience in film development and the use of IT through the film production and editing.

Eddie is also proud that he no longer has a guardian appointed by the Office of Public Advocate. Eddie has a few more changes that he would like to make, however he is ready for any challenges in the future and has control of most areas of his life.

Promoting independent living

Tanya Van Gils recently moved into a unit and is supported by the McCallum Home Support program to live independently.

Over the past six months, Tanya has undertaken bus travel training, learnt how to use her EFTPOS card, and is beginning to understand her household budget.

"I really love working with my McCallum staff (as) they help me learn but they are also my friends," Tanya said.

McCallum works hard to introduce skilled staff that are compatible with the person they are supporting.

The involvement of each client's family, friends and support network is strongly encouraged and promoted.

This helps to maximise the person's enjoyment and participation in the program by supporting them to plan for the future and identify the goals and the lifestyle they wish to enjoy.

While initially a little apprehensive about their daughter's move to independent living, Tanya's parents, Elly and Andy Grenfell, said she had flourished in the new environment and was in control of her life.

"It has given us the chance to go travelling and do what we want to do without too many worries," Mrs Grenfell said.

Reviewing the past year is always an interesting experience. We tend to spend so much time looking forward we can forget to look back, and it is good to look back and enjoy the efforts of all at McCallum Industries.

The year held many challenges for us, not least the introduction of a new Industrial Award for supported employees. The Supported Employment Services Award came into effect with changes to working hours, increased hourly pay rates and the introduction of superannuation for supported employees. In addition to the Award, State funded employees undertook wage assessments for the first time in line with their Commonwealth funded colleagues. Overall the outcomes have been very positive and reflect the effort put in by employees.

On the business front we purchased a new Vertical Form Fill and Seal (VFFS) machine for Ollie's Lollies. The VFFS machine is an all in one machine that allows bulk lollies to be tipped in one end and a completed bag emerges at the other! It's not quite as simple as that, but the outcome is that Ollie's has colourful bags of lollies that rivals any competitor in the market.

It is also planned to offer contract packing services to customers. The machine is capable of packing many types of food products such as lollies, chocolates, nuts and beans.

The Cloth and Packing Units continued to perform well with new customers seeking our services on a regular basis. More and more the Business Units are moulding into one as employees move between Units as labour demands. It is a credit to all employees and staff that they are so flexible in their approach.

For the second year running, our Production Coordinator, Rick Fleming, took leave to volunteer his services overseas. Rick spent 14 weeks with the Mekong Plus organisation in South Vietnam assisting disadvantaged families and communities. While Rick was away it was a great chance for staff to try new jobs and gain valuable experience in new roles.

We were pleased to come through our service audit with flying colours. McCallum Industries is assessed against the Commonwealth Employment Standards and 2010 saw a complete audit of our service to supported employees and families. It is a great opportunity to review what we currently do and find ways to improve the way we operate.

But it's not work all of the time with the McCallum Industries' Employee Social Club enjoying some great functions throughout the year. The Christmas function at the Buninyong Golf Club was a highlight along with a BBQ and Melbourne Cup luncheon. A visit from the North Melbourne Football Club was also welcomed with some employees showing great skill with the oval ball which impressed the Kangaroo boys immensely.

It is satisfying to look back at the past year and enjoy the successes and highlights. But it is also time to look forward again as there is much to do.

The past year has been a year of challenge and change. We have had an organisation State Certification audit and we are constantly fine tuning our methods and approaches to improve the services we offer. We do this by communicating constantly with clients, their families and carers. Our staff are trained in specialist communication skills to support service users to express their needs and the kind of service they require. The responses of clients to the quality and design of the programs we offer are constantly monitored and reviewed.

Staff are trained in the latest methods and approaches to delivering quality individualised plans. Each service user has their own unique Person Centred Plan designed to offer maximum outcomes. These plans entail careful consideration and consultation with the parties invited by the service user to be involved in the content of the plan. Service users are supported to achieve the goals set out in their plan as an individual or part of a group.

Our seven community support units offer an array of programs designed to meet and support the varying needs of clients. Each unit has a focus that offers the individual an opportunity to develop and enhance their skills in various community options.

We support our local community in many ways, and clients are encouraged and supporter to access local facilities as often as possible. Educational options and support are also offered through partnerships with the University of Ballarat, School of Mines (SMB),

BRACE and other community centres. Our Art and Pottery Studio offer clients and community members the opportunity to express their artistic skills to produce some wonderful and interesting paintings and pieces.

Staff attended training to enhance and increase their skills to meet the challenges and changes ahead. Training this year has included Planning for Individuals, All Stars Training, Ethical Response and Safe Practices, Complex Communication, Fire Prevention, Manual Handling and CPR, Appropriate Behaviour in the Workplace, Prevention of Bullying in the Workplace and the Charter of Human Rights and the UN Charter of Rights of Persons with a Disability.

Thank you to everyone for your support and encouragement over the past year. Thank you to the dedicated team of Coordinators and staff for meeting the great challenges that confronted us in the past year. Gail Walker our Administration Coordinator has also worked tirelessly throughout the last year to improve our services, communication and information sharing across programs. I am confident that we can face the next year in the knowledge that we are equipped whatever challenges it may present.

Unit Reports

Dawson

Dawson is based at the Alfredton site and operates as an independent unit. This program area caters for the needs of adults of the Autism spectrum and clients who may have experienced institutionalisation. These people benefit from a structured routine with lots of staff support. Clients who fear change and may experience anxieties can develop a sense of comfort and feel safe in this routine. Clients are encouraged to make choices, develop appropriate interactions with others, share space with fellow clients and feel safe. From the security gained, clients can manage a timetable that incorporates community based programs such as aquatics, 10 pin bowling, gymnastics, farm visits, shopping and coffee. A variety of 1-1 community interactions are available. Excursions to concerts, festivals and BBQs in country Victoria occur each week. Inhouse programs include communication network sessions, light industrial work skills, vegetable cutting and delivery to the Wildlife Park, fitness for fun, Boardmaker bingo, sensory activities, massage and planned relaxation. Dawson has been operating for several years and has proven to be very successful for many clients who have been able to move on to meet new challenges.

CLUB LOWD (LIFE OPTIONS AND WORK DIRECTION)

Club LOWD are involved in a number of volunteer options in the community giving the client group skills in communication and enhancing their work ethic. Club LOWD are always looking for new programs and volunteer options to allow clients new and exciting choices.

Our volunteer options that we participate include Meals on wheels, operating two services for meals on wheels two days per week where clients assemble the trays of food then deliver the meals to the door independently.

Three clients have been assisting other volunteers at the Wendouree Opportunity Shop one day per week in clothes sorting, cleaning the shop, sales and clothes tagging. Club LOWD also caters to a small group of people to assist with gardening needs.

Unit Reports

A group of clients also deliver and restock Ollies lollies to businesses around Ballarat. The group also return unwanted lollies and handle monies from purchases.

Club LOWD clients also assist in the cleaning the soup bus, the soup bus provide food and clothing to the underprivileged in Ballarat four nights a week.

Clients attend Radio 99.9 FM in Dawson St on a Monday afternoon and record sport, music and local events, this is then played back on a Monday night at 10pm.

Drummond

The Drummond Support Unit has undergone many positive changes throughout this year. We have welcomed many new staff to our innovative team and introduced many new and interesting programs.

One of our most successful examples has been the introduction of a 'Morning Exercise Program' which involves the clients in one hour of physical exercise, within the community each day. Client's are encouraged to participate in a variety of games and activities, utilising a number of different local, community venues including the Eastwood Leisure Complex, Victoria Park and White Flat Football Oval.

This term has seen a focus specifically on Soccer and basketball with fantastic results. Clients are ready and rearing to go each morning and we have seen a marked improvement in ball handling skills as well as general fitness.

Yarrowee Parade

Yarrowee Parade Community based unit focuses on developing the person's life skills with an emphasis on assessing, developing and maintaining skills, supporting people to become independent.

This year has seen some considerable changes across the unit to improve and build on our person centred approach in our day to day programs and activities.

As part of our community participation program Yarrowee participants are involved in the community meals on wheels program, and visit the Jack Lonsdale nursing home every fortnight to run a music program with the elderly. Everyone moves and sings along to songs remembered from the past, with some solo performances. The music and sense of fun brings everyone together for a great afternoon. We have built up some great rapport with the Jack Lonsdale residents as this program has become very popular they look forward to our visits and the client group enjoy the interaction with them.

Yarrowee Parade run a very popular and always growing woodwork program from the garage where participants from other units come to join and work on individual client driven pieces of interest. Some of the woodwork pieces they have made are CD racks, toolboxes, pencil boxes photo frames etc, last year woodwork participants took great pride in entering their woodwork pieces into exhibitions at the Ballarat show, with many entries winning prizes, and many more participants have been working on their pieces for the entry into the 2011 Ballarat show.

Other activities that Yarrowee offer are cooking, gym programs, SMB classes offering Certificate One in Work Education, Gardening, Music and Dance, Drama, photography, swimming and more.

The Yarrowee gardening group are currently working on a project to produce a sensory garden with a small Boccia lawn, for the clients to use at Yarrowee, they have been very busy hand making some lovely sensory pavers for the area.

Eureka

We have had many success stories at Eureka which showcases the passion and dedication the staff is bringing with them to always look outside the square and find solutions to what can at times be challenging and tiring situations.

One such situation was the introduction of the program "Art to Eureka". This program has encouraged clients which are not comfortable in leaving the security of the Unit to enjoy and experience the joy of painting, their works are then displayed proudly in the Eureka Unit.

We also run an excursion "Community in Action". This program showcases a variety of attractions in the local community the aim of these trips are to promote educational and sensory activities. The group are encouraged in decision making and to develop awareness of their environment and local community.

We have visited Yuulong Lavender Estate, Rokewood and Wilbur the Pig, Lal Lal falls, Cottonwood Valley, Creswick Woollen Mills and Daylesford Cider Company just to name a few. While on excursion the group will share a morning tea, have a walk around the grounds enjoying the location and what they have to offer.

Fridays the unit enjoy a shared lunch. This enables the group to explore local shopping venues, purchase requirements needed, decision making and lunch choice. We incorporated a Hot Dog fundraiser and donated the monies raised to the Smythesdale Public Gardens, which is a location often enjoyed by the Community in Action Group.

In the last 12 months we have raised money for the PINK big breakfast, we hosted an afternoon tea which was open to all clients, staff, friends and family, we had two guest speakers from the Cancer Association come and talk about their experiences of living with cancer.

We hosted a Christmas in July lunch with all monies being raised going to the 3BA Christmas in July appeal, Lyons Street clients and staff sponsor a child through world vision; we recently sent a letter with pictures of Australian animals to our host girl in Chile.

We have several clients that attend SMB adult learning facility. These clients enjoy the social interactions as well as the academic opportunities. Nine clients attend the SMB gymnasium once a week for a gym program, this program is part of a Physical Education course and our guys are partnered up on a 1:1 basis for the year with a student to complete their assessments.

We also hosted a parent, carer and family afternoon tea, giving all a chance to catch up and meet new family and friends and enjoy a nice cuppa and afternoon tea.






Sources of Operating Revenue



Operating Expenditure by Category




Operating Income by Program




