We are pleased to have offered service to more than 380 participants across the year – an increasing trend in those seeking our services which we have pleasingly seen for multiple years now and which is evidence of our important position as a leading service provider in the region.

Continuing in our message of growth, this year we have successfully acquired land in Arthur Street which we will look to develop to ensure we can provide more high quality accommodation and services in our region, and we will continue to seek partnerships and opportunities to build our portfolio to enable us to do more of what we do best.

McCallum is a proud place based agency, and in St Arnaud we have also increased our accommodation offering, which has supported people with a disability to remain able to live and age in place in the community in which they want to live, not just where the NDIS market has vacancies.

You will see we have also launched a new name for our Social Enterprises – McCallum Enterprises. This portfolio is a vital and important employment option for our community and we continue to seek commercial partners to ensure we can do more of our good work across 22 enterprises, always with a view to building our capability to match market needs and work in more and varied places.



It has been a year with some unplanned challenges, but it is when we band together we retain our strength and energy to reimagine our opportunity to be a leading service provider and we are proud that we continue to evolve alongside the needs of the community.

We would like to sincerely thank the Directors for their leadership, and the entire Executive and staff at McCallum who work every day in and for our community and who maintain an unwavering commitment to our colleagues and participants who work and live with a disability.

And it is the participants, our supported employees and their families and carers who are deserving of our greatest thanks for entrusting us with your support and we look forward to strengthening our collaboration and ensuring your voices are at the centre of the work we do.

DISABILITY SERVICES

This year has been one of transformation and consolidation, as we reshaped our leadership structure and service delivery to better position the organisation for the future.

The establishment of a General Manager, Customer Outcomes has brought all direct support programs—Groups, 1:1 Supports, Home and Living, St Arnaud operations, and Support Coordination—under one portfolio. This contemporary structure has streamlined reporting lines, strengthened accountability, and created greater cohesion across our services.

In Home and Living, the introduction of a Senior Team Leader model—with oversight across multiple properties—has enhanced consistency in practice leadership and reduced administrative burden, allowing more focus on quality outcomes for residents.

Our Community Access programs have also undergone significant renewal. With a new Community Access Manager and Lifestyle Options Team Leader driving these services, we are already seeing improved program quality and stronger participant outcomes, with several success stories highlighted throughout this report.

Despite the shifting policy landscape and ongoing uncertainty regarding the long-term role of Support Coordinators within the NDIS, our Support Coordination team has remained a steady and reliable support for participants navigating their plans and pursuing their goals.

Across the organisation, we have celebrated many participants achieving life-changing personal milestones. These achievements continue to inspire our teams and reinforce the impact of our work.

Looking ahead, we are committed to modernising our group programs to reflect evolving participant interests and market expectations. We will continue to invest in innovative program offerings in technology and gaming, life skills development, and expanded community access. Increasingly, our programs will take place outside traditional centre-based models, leveraging community infrastructure to deliver more inclusive opportunities.

We are also preparing for the commencement of new housing projects, which will provide modern, accessible homes and greater independence for existing residents. These developments mark an important step in expanding choice, control, and quality of life for people with disability.

As we step into the next year, our focus will be on deepening our community presence, creating innovative pathways for participation, and continuing to empower people with disability to live with independence, connection, and purpose.

MCCALLUM ENTERPRISES



It's been another remarkable year for McCallum Social Enterprise, marked by consolidation, innovation, and growth across our diverse operations. Our teams have delivered exceptional service to customers across Ballarat, Daylesford, Hepburn, Melbourne, and into the wider Grampians region including Halls Gap, Horsham, and Dimboola.

Key structural changes included the closure of cloth recycling and rag sales, the integration of Gardening into our Landscaping team, and the relocation of McCallum Linen from Coronet Street to our renovated Sturt Street facility.

The McCallum Linen business is investing in RFID technology for enhanced efficiency and to enable us to provide the best possible service and quality to our new and old linen customers.

Our Container Deposit Scheme (CDS) sites at Neerim Crescent and Butt Street processed their 19 millionth container in December. Since the activation of these sites at McCallum, demand has continued to grow. To support this increased volume, a third singulator was installed at the Butt Street site with the support of Tomra Cleanaway.

The School Leavers Employment Supports (SLES) program expanded into St Arnaud and saw an increase in participants in Ballarat. We also saw the activation of some new commercial partnerships with new business activated in packaging, linen and cleaning services.

The Landscaping team was successful in tendering for two stages of works at the Ballarat Station Upgrade. Focus has also been given to the marketing of our timber manufacturing business including "Spud Crates" and a range of standard and custom pallets being promoted by our Business Development Manager to prospective and current customers across the Ballarat region. An application was also made for philanthropic support to purchase an automated pallet making machine to improve safety and optimise efficiencies.

Our packaging teams continue to do amazing work including blending, packing and shipping of the range of Grounded Pleasures products (a local Ballarat partner), along with other works for a range of other customers. Our Sturt Street packaging team have continued to support Danbar, (packaging a recycled plastic reinforcing product manufactured in Ballarat).

Another exciting new customer for the team was the Ballarat Wildlife Park who we've partnered with the pack the small retail bags of "Kangaroo Food" sold to visitors to one of Ballarat's premier tourist attractions.

These initiatives, alongside continued investment in technology and partnerships, position us for sustainable impact and growth.

Thank you to our staff, partners, and customers for your continued support.



OUR PEOPLE UPDATE

Workforce movement

McCallum's overall workforce remained steady at 500 employees for the financial year. This is inclusive of 199 Supported Employees and we're very proud that almost 40% of our employees are those living with a disability.

We continue to have a strong reputation as an employer of choice in the disability services sector which enables us to easily recruit to disability support and supported employment vacancies.

Workplace Gender Equality Submission

June 2025 saw our second Workplace Gender Equality Agency (WGEA) mandatory reporting. Based on our data the outcome was a -24% pay gap meaning that on average women are paid more than men at McCallum. As part of our commitment to Inclusion and Diversity a new strategy has been developed and is moving through its approval processes including Executive and Board Committee at the Level. This strategy includes a range of initiatives focused on gender equality.

People Systems and Employee Services

A continuous improvement project to reinvigorate our Learning Management System (LMS) was launched early in the financial year and a new provider was found that provides us with a solution to meet our compliance requirements relating to employee training with greater functionality and simplicity.

We also implemented a new Recruitment Management System (RMS) throughout during the financial year which has resulted in efficiencies and a reduction in manual administration required to support recruitment.

We also undertook a review of our current Employee Assistance Program (EAP), and as a result, are seeking an enhanced service to match and align with our service/operating hours and to provide access to a greater breadth and depth of wellbeing resources for our employees. The selected tendering process will be completed late September 2025.



Industrial Relations Update

We have continued to work through the challenges that have come from the extension of our Zombie Agreements which were initially due to sunset on 6 December 2023. Not being able to move to the same award for all Disability Services employees has continued the complexities we had, however we are engaged with process and are currently awaiting an outcome from the Fair Work Commission on any further extension.

It has been a busy time within the Industrial Relations space as we have recently commenced the Supported Bargaining process which sees us negotiating a new Enterprise Agreement which will apply to our Disability Services employees in conjunction with 10 other disability service providers.

Strengthening our focus on well-being Throughout the financial year period, we continued to provide an EAP which was utilised by 20 employees for over 90 employee counselling services and 15 critical incident debrief services. These services continue to provide emotional support to employees in a free, sensitive and confidential manner.

Safety

McCallum's Safety Manager commenced in October 2024. This has strengthened McCallum's safe system of work and enabled better outcomes for our injured workers. Currently, we have 14 Health and Safety Representatives (HSR's) and our main OHS consultative mechanisms between HSR's their Work Groups, Supervisors and Managers, continues via a quarterly OH&S committee and an Enterprise safety working group.

Our WorkCover premium has seen a significant reduction of 13.32% in FY 24/25 with a decrease in WorkCover claims and a better return to work performance than the industry average.

Our Enterprise sites at Neerim and Walker St successfully passed OH&S Surveillance Audit for compliance to ISO 45001:2018 in March 2025 which was a great effort for all involved and was recognition for the diligent work by a number of people, over a period of time.



ALL THINGS GROWTH

As we reflect on the previous financial year we can look back on a period marked by significant growth and reinvigorating our strong brand across our Social Enterprise.

Our two Container Deposit Scheme automated depots in Ballarat have continued to flourish, creating increased employment opportunities for our team of Supported Employees. The demand for our automated depots has surged, with over 22 million containers processed across both Mitchell Park and Canadian sites. Such was the demand from the community, a further container processing "singulator" was installed at our Canadian site by Tomra Cleanaway to help with efficiency.

The Commercial Container Collection Program has also experienced tremendous success, now catering to over 180 customers, including a diverse array of sporting clubs, restaurants, and nightclubs. This initiative alone has resulted in the collection of more than 1.1 million containers. Each container collected reflects an increasing awareness and responsibility towards waste management within the business sector, and we are proud to lead such efforts.

In parallel, McCallum Linen has solidified its status as a preferred linen hire supplier, serving over 400 accommodation providers throughout Ballarat, Daylesford, and Hepburn.

The quality of our services, combined with our commitment to reliability, has established strong relationships with our clientele.

Over the past year, our dedicated team delivered an impressive 1,300 tonnes of linen to these partners. This included a recent growth opportunity into the Grampians and Wimmera regions where a further 35 customers came on board in April 2025.

Another highlight of the year was McCallum Enterprises' achievement in securing a Perpetual Impact Grant from the Percy Baxter Philanthropic Fund. This funding will be instrumental in the purchase of an automated pallet making machine at our Neerim Crescent site.

The introduction of this technology is set to transform our operations by significantly increasing productivity and reducing occupational health and safety risks. Additionally, it will create more opportunities for lower capability Supported Employees in our timber manufacturing department, reinforcing our commitment to inclusivity.

Finally, as we looked toward the future we began planning to complete our Social Enterprise's merger which began in 2022. Following the McCallum Industries and Ballarat Regional Industries merger, the final piece of the puzzle was to unite under a single brand identity.







BALLARAT JOBS EXPO

JULY 2024

On Friday 26 July our School Leaver's Employment Supports (SLES) program team was on-site at the Ballarat Jobs Expo at The Goods Shed. We met with a lot of people explaining the benefits of our program, as well as showing off our Golden Opportunity work experience food van.

The van was a roaring success and had a queue of people lined up purchasing coffees and sweet treats!



35 YEARS OF DEDICATED SERVICE

AUGUST 2024

On 1 August our Executive Manager – Accommodation Services, Noelene Collins, notched up 35 years of service at McCallum. Noelene has played a pivotal role in McCallum's growth and has helped many vulnerable people living with disability to find suitable accommodation and support in the region.

Noelene has witnessed many of our residents prosper from young adults to ageing residents, as well as having to say goodbye to some special people along the way. Noelene's dedication and care to our community is inspirational and is a leader that has changed countless families lives during her tenure.

MCCALLUM'S LATEST LAND ACQUISITION

AUGUST 2024

Following more than a decade of hard work and meetings with various government departments and officials, McCallum finally purchased vacant residential land next to our head office in Alfredton. The site will allow McCallum to develop four modern Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA) homes for existing residents that currently live in homes no longer fit for their needs.

It is expected that construction of the new homes will begin in early 2026 with residents moving in prior to Christmas the same year.



MORE LANDSCAPING AT GOVHUB

AUGUST 2024

Prior to the merger of our Social Enterprises businesses McCallum Industries and Ballarat Regional Industries (BRI), BRI completed a large scale landscaping project at the \$100m Ballarat GovHub development.

Following the success of this project, the newly merged team from McCallum BRI, were invited to complete further garden bed waterproofing works.







LONGSTANDING CEO RESIGNATION

SEPTEMBER 2024

After 18 years of dedicated service to McCallum, Tyrone McCuskey has officially resigned from his position as Chief Executive Officer.

Over the past decade, he has successfully guided the organization through significant milestones, including the introduction of the National Disability Insurance Scheme and navigating the challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic, during which the team continued to serve some of the community's most vulnerable individuals.

2024/25 COMMENTARY



The financial year ending 30 June 2025 presented significant challenges for McCallum, with difficult operating conditions impacting the organisation's ability to achieve a positive financial outcome.

Despite these headwinds, total income increased by \$1.991 million, representing a 6.3% uplift. This growth was primarily driven by a strong performance in McCallum's core NDIS disability services, which saw income rise by \$2.223 million (10.1%), supporting continued organisational expansion. Additionally, the Social Enterprise division recorded a \$0.459 million (6.6%) increase in revenue, largely attributable to the full-year impact of the Container Deposit Scheme.

However, these gains were partially offset by a \$0.818 million (108.7%) reduction in proceeds from the sale of fixed assets, which had contributed one-off gains in the prior year.

Despite solid revenue growth, total expenses rose by \$2.562 million (7.9%), outpacing income. The primary driver of this increase was employee benefits, which grew by \$2.077 million (8.4%) due to mandated adjustments to award entitlements (3.75%) and the superannuation guarantee (0.5%).

These cost pressures were exacerbated by the NDIS price guide indexation of just 3.19% for the 2024–25 financial year, which did not keep pace with the rising wage and superannuation obligations, placing further strain on financial sustainability.

As a result, the deficit from operating activities reached \$1.457 million—an increase of \$0.571 million (64.4%) compared to the financial year ending 30 June 2023. Notably, the prior year included \$0.754 million in one-off asset sales. When adjusted for these non-recurring items, the underlying business performance shows a marginal year-on-year improvement.
